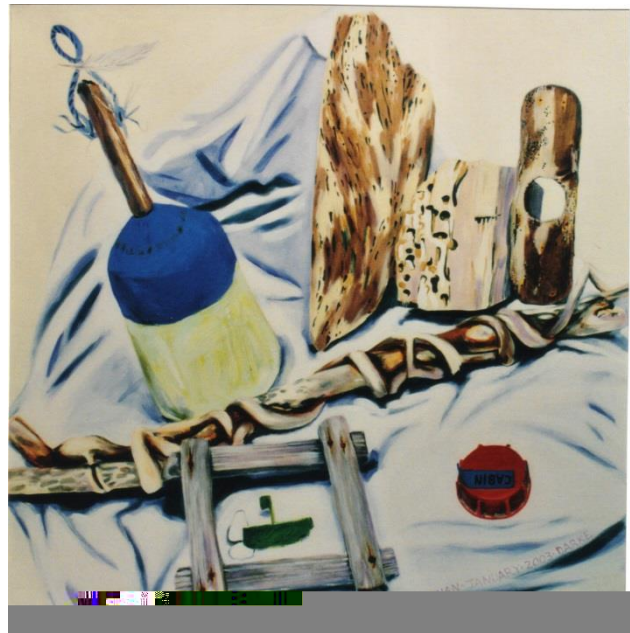
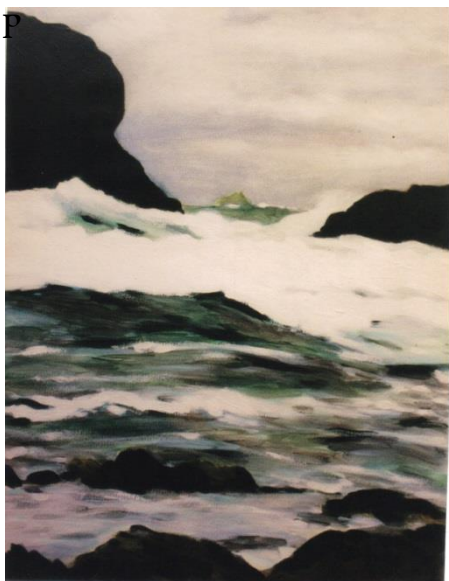


14. Wrecking Resources Jane Darke 2015

Create Beach art

- Make shell and pebble mosaics on the sand
- Make giant sand sculptures and wild sand castles
- Use sticks and hands to write giant words in wet sand
- Create beach collages using plastic and found objects from the strandline
- Sketch simple drawings in wet sand using a stone
- Take a sketch book and draw the sea, try to capture the movement of the breaking waves.
- Photograph different areas of the beach from different angles.
- Create a wreck sculpture.
- Make patterns and stacks with pebbles

Create your own paintings that explore different aspects of the beach and samples of wreck.

Try experimenting with all sorts of media, oil pastels, watercolours, acrylic, paper and tissue collage, textured paint with sand mixed in, charcoal, coloured inks to create your own sea inspired masterpiece.
